64. MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON THE 16<sup>th</sup> March 2011

66. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

- a) Provision of Bins – Report 1650/TC 8<sup>th</sup> June 2009 (Appendix 1 to the agenda) and part of Report 1880/AM (Appendix 5 to the agenda)

Members discussed SBCs proposal to provide bins as requested in the Triangle and the additional cost that LTC would pay to upgrade them to Victoriana style bins. Issues of the need for ashtrays on the top of any new bins and sponsorship schemes were also debated.

It was **RESOLVED** to ascertain what guidelines would be applied to sponsorship signage from SBC.

It was **RESOLVED** to obtain costings for the provision of bins in the Triangle area of the Broadway and to enquire about the provision of ashtrays on bins.

- b) Request for seat at Highlands Boulevard.

As a seat had been provided in Stirling Avenue it was **RESOLVED** to defer a decision for seat for further consultation with members of the Community Transport scheme.

- c) Proposed Traffic Orders (Parking) – Response from Cllr Mark Flewitt (Appendix 3 to the agenda)

Members **noted** the report and would await further developments, including the formal response from LTC's objections.

- d) ECC Parish Transport Representatives Meeting – Report 1879/DF (Appendix 4 to the agenda) and the withdrawal of No 24 Bus from Leigh Railway Station to Rawreth.

CLr Donald Fraser spoke to the report and informed the Committee that the rerouted service 3 would not be serving Highlands Boulevard because SBC were not prepared to finance it.

- e) Actions from Protocol Meeting and Old Town Meeting 10<sup>th</sup> March 2011 – Report 1880/AM (Appendix 5 to the agenda)

Members discussed the remaining issues on the report that were relevant to T&H. Discussion centred around the policy relating to dropped kerbs PVXs and the use of bollards to enforce infringements, in particular the use of LTC ornamental bollards. There was some doubt as to whether this meant using LTC's stock of bollards or ones of the same design.

It was **RESOLVED** to write to SBC to clarify this point.

- f) Traffic Sensitive Streets – Report 1881/TC Results of Consultation (Appendix 6 to the agenda)

The Committee **NOTED** the response from SBC and the retention of Elmsleigh Drive and the inclusion of Hadleigh Road (London Road to Rectory Grove) and Marine Parade in the list.
